To find your nearest landfill site, telephone the regulator Entrust on 01926 488300.</li> <li>The site must be owned by the applicant or there must be a signed lease of more than 10 years in place between the applicant and the landowner.</li> <li>The total cost of the project must be less than £200,000, inclusive of VAT.</li> <li>There must be a minimum of 104 days of full public access to the project per year.</li> <li>Any Biffa Award grant must be used for site-based improvement work.</li> <li>Biffa Award is unable to fund retrospectively, so you should only apply for funding for work that will take place in the future.</li> </ol>
