NEW: Allergen labelling

A new allergen labelling law came into effect on 1 October which requires organisations, including churches, to label all food that is prepacked for direct sale with a full list of ingredients, with the 14 major allergens emphasised in the list. The new law applies to foods packaged on the same site at which they are sold before being ordered; foods pre-packaged elsewhere already require full ingredients labelling, with allergens emphasised in the list. Zoom Event: Finding God in Threads and Patches with Claire Cullingworth 4th November 6:00-7:00

Mending clothes uses a set of very traditional skills that have largely gone out of favour in the last few decades. In this session, Claire will tell the story of how simple and seemingly mundane acts such as patching jeans and darning socks have helped her to see God with fresh eyes, and to find hope when things seemed dark. Visible mending is a modern creative twist on traditional mending, making a creative feature out of repairs, rather than treating them as something to be hidden away discretely. (You could think of it as a fabric parallel to the Japanese art of Kintsugi, repairing pottery with gold) With fast fashion making clothing increasingly cheap and disposable, visible repair can be a revolutionary act. We'll spend some time in this session thinking about how this creative practice can change our relationship with our clothes, with ourselves and with our environment. Is it possible to have a spirituality of mending?
