ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION PLAN 2023: ENERGY USE

Note by the Environment Working Group

A. Procedures: no direct cost

- 1. Encourage churches to register with Eco Church.
- 2. Encourage Eco churches to use the questionnaire from Eco Church to examine their building, energy use and lifestyle.
- 3. Big emphasis on churches and halls using the CofE Energy Footprint Tool; annually report energy use and carbon emissions.
- 4. Ministerial and Lay Training on carbon net zero and other environmental concerns.
- 5. Develop a policy on church heating (majority of carbon emissions from building), also identifying expertise and potential grants. Encourage forward planning, i.e. when heating might be changed even if not yet.
- 6. Facebook page to share experience and information on permission, technical and financial advice, installation.
- 7. Campaigning for climate justice and support for victims of extreme weather incidents, informed by mission partners.

B. Investments: minor

- Identify some 'quick wins', via: "Practical Path to Net Zero Carbon for Church Buildings". https://www.churchofengland.org/resources/churchcare/net-zerocarbon-church
- 9. Using LED lighting for churches, houses, schools, and commercial property.
- 10. Adopting renewable energy suppliers.
- 11. Electrical vehicle charging points at vicarages and other buildings.

C. Investments: major (see 5. above)

- 12. Ground and air source heat pumps and other electrical systems where beneficial for churches, houses, schools and commercial property.
- 13. Solar PV on churches, church halls, etc. if cost-effective.
- 14. Other electrical heating systems installed/converted where suitable.
- 15. Insulation, windows, etc.
