

Diocesan Synod 2025 Budget and Parish Share Consultation Process Tom Royle, Head of Finance

1. Summary

Budget consultation letters were sent out on the 13th September to all parishes requesting parishes to respond with their offers by the 18th October. The paper sets out the timeline for those responses and when the budget will eventually be passed.

2. Financial Challenge

We understand the financial challenges being faced by parishes due to rising costs and falling income. Over recent years we have had a cost-of-living crisis and levels of inflation unseen in over a decade which has impacted both congregations and parishes.

This has led to a declining amount in parish share received by the diocese and in reality, when taking inflation into account, the diocese is around £1.5m worse off than it was precovid.

3. Our ask

As a result of this the diocese has had to ask for an 8% increase on parish share from parishes in 2025 and it is hoped that parishes can achieve this despite difficult circumstances.

The 8% will mainly prevent costs from increasing further due to inflationary increases within stipend and general expenditure, it will also shave a small amount from our annual deficit as the diocese looks to move into a more sustainable position. It must be remembered that Synod set a target of achieving a balanced budget within the next 2-3 years.

4. Timeline

The parish share consultation letters were sent out on the 13th September and all responses are to be received by the 18th October.

A first draft budget will then be presented to the Finance Group along with the findings from the budget consultation on the 24th October.

The budget will then be recommended to Bishops Council on the 7th November and it will then be passed by Synod on the 9th November



13th September – Parish share consultation letters sent

8th October – Responses to consultation letter received and udget prepared

24th October – 1st draft budget presented to Finance Group along with parish share consultation findings

7th November – Budget is recommended by Finance Group to Bishop's Council

9th November – Budget is passed by Dioesan Synod
