LEGACY GIVING Checklist



So now you are ready to get your legacy giving under way - so you need to get your foundations right



Share your vision – inspire people to want to include your parish in their wills by talking about what your parish is doing to share its mission and develop it's ministry.



Make time to discuss this at PCC – have you got your PCC Legacy toolkit – you can order one here if you don't (https://www.churchprinthub.org/product.aspx?prod=SL1014PK&cat=4)



Build trust – talk about how you use gifts – either now or in the past, be open with your policies so people know that they can trust you to honour their wishes



Here is the perfect time to get your legacy policy in order – you can use this as a template (https://www.parishresources.org.uk/legacies/developing-a-legacy-policy/) or get in touch with the Generous Giving Team for support



Demonstrate impact – great if you have your own, or share from other parishes so people can see the actual, real life impact of making a gift



Frequent messaging (normalise it) – this is a group effort – talk about generosity and giving in all forms, but do make mention and refer to legacy giving in sermons, in PCC's, in days of thanksgiving.



Make sure you always have information available – you never know what that interest may turn into action – head over to the Print hub (https://www.churchprinthub.org/default.aspx? q=legacies&cat=4) and you can order book marks, leaflets, posters, information booklets – these can even be personalised. Remember – drip, drip, drip



Celebrate generosity and thank appropriately – legacies are usually a very meaningful and so celebrating these will continue to honour the person who has decided to make the gift. Whatever the legacy was used for – find a way to mark with thanks – maybe it is a picture, a plate, a plaque, a memorial book.
